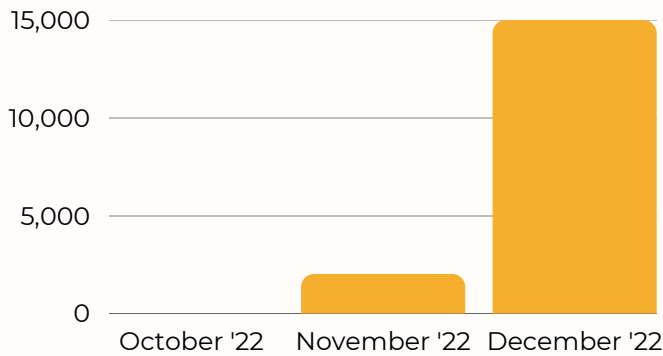

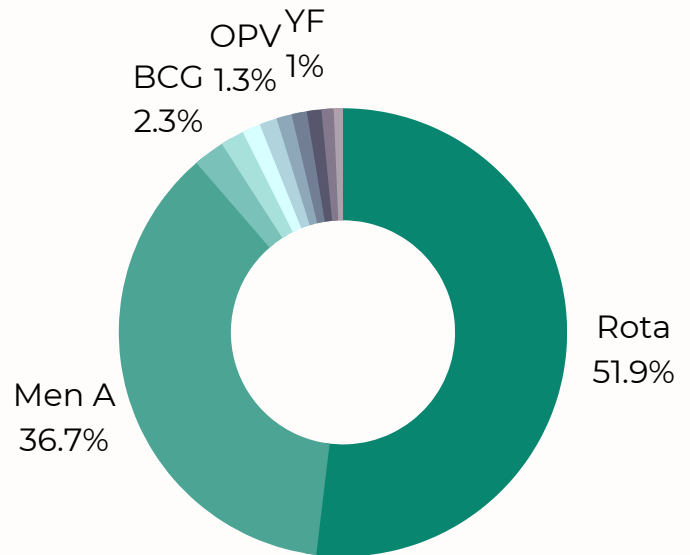

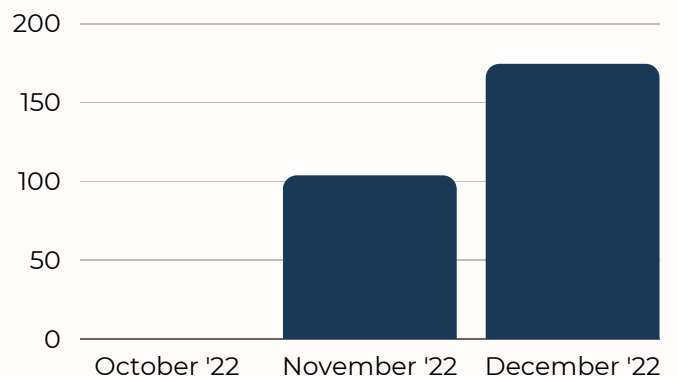

CHALLENGES

A number of challenges were also encountered by the All Babies program. One challenge we encountered was the distribution of insufficient vaccine supplies to all states in quarter 4, leading to significant shortfalls and stockouts through the end of the year. These stockouts were resolved by the quarter 1 distribution in January, and we look forward to more sufficient vaccine commodity allocations in future quarters. A second persistent challenge relates to insufficient routine immunization administrative data and recordkeeping at the facility level. NI-ABAE greatly appreciates the support of states to encourage clinic staff to input accurate, timely, and complete data.
